PONTARLIER, FRANCE

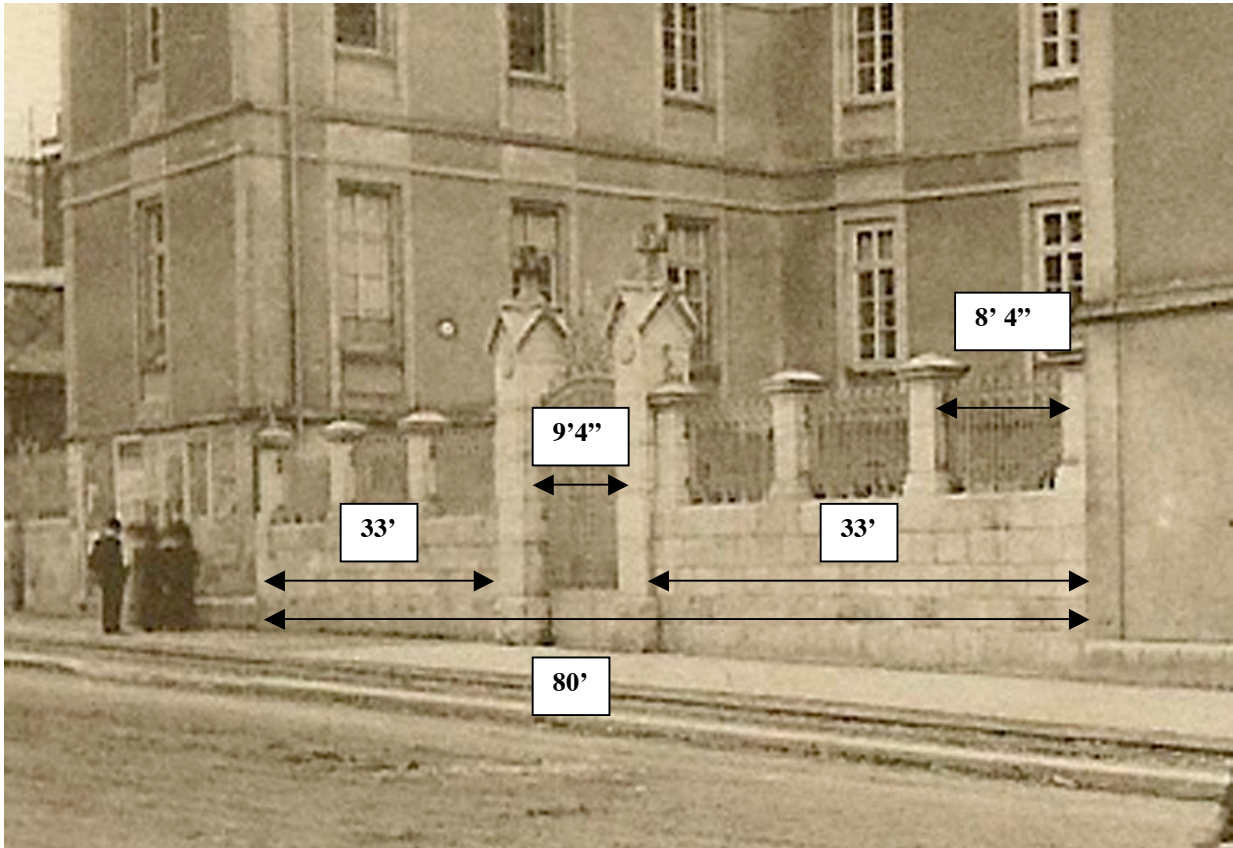
Originally part of the ancient Roman station of Ariolica, Pontarlier is located on the Swiss border of France's Burgundy region and was famous for its absinthe production until 1915.

The hospital itself has a rich historic past. It has survived four wars and three invasions, had its resident sisters driven out by the Revolutionary Committee in 1793, and was gifted with 16,000 books by Napoleon from his personal library in 1809.

**Approximate dimensions--**

Large entry gate pillars: 30" w x 30" d diagonal cut,  
 14' 6" without iron cross (cross appr. 2' 6" high)

Main gate span: 9' 4" wide

Small pillars: 20" w x 14" x 5' high

Small pillar wall caps: 15" h x 20" wide

Side gate span, each: 8' 4"

Side span total, each side: 33'

Total span end to end: 80'
